Problem 1. (6 points)

(a) Find the least squares solution to $\begin{bmatrix} 1 & -1 \\ 1 & 1 \\ 1 & 1 \\ 1 & 2 \end{bmatrix} \mathbf{x} = \begin{bmatrix} 5 \\ 2 \\ 0 \\ -1 \end{bmatrix}$.

(b) Determine the least squares line for the data points $(-1, 5), (1, 2), (1, 0), (2, -1)$.

Problem 2. (9 points)

- (a) Using Gram–Schmidt, obtain an orthonormal basis for $W = \text{span} \left\{ \begin{bmatrix} 2 \\ 1 \\ -2 \end{bmatrix}, \begin{bmatrix} 1 \\ 1 \\ -3 \end{bmatrix} \right\}$.
- (b) Determine the orthogonal projection of $\begin{bmatrix} 3 \\ 3 \\ 0 \end{bmatrix}$ onto W .
- (c) Determine the QR decomposition of the matrix $\begin{bmatrix} 2 & 1 \\ 1 & 1 \\ -2 & -3 \end{bmatrix}$.
- (d) Determine a basis for the orthogonal complement W^\perp .

Problem 3. (3 points) Set up a linear system to find values for the parameters a, b such that $z = ax + by$ best fits some given points $(x_1, y_1, z_1), (x_2, y_2, z_2), \dots$

Problem 4. (2 points) Write down a precise definition of what it means for vectors $\mathbf{v}_1, \mathbf{v}_2, \dots, \mathbf{v}_m \in \mathbb{R}^n$ to be linearly independent.

Vectors $\mathbf{v}_1, \mathbf{v}_2, \dots, \mathbf{v}_m \in \mathbb{R}^n$ are linearly independent if and only if ...

Problem 5. (8 points) Fill in the blanks.
